

Grade 12 Post-Secondary Timeline

Each Month:

1. Scan those awesome Career Updates at the beginning of each month. They are loaded with useful information and important dates.
2. Search for scholarships. Set aside some time each month to work on these. Check out search engines such as www.studentawards.com, www.studentscholarships.org and www.scholarshipscanada.com. Obtain reference letters.

September:

- You can apply for First Qualified, First Admitted programs at Saskatchewan Polytechnic that require a grade 12. Submit a current transcript from your principal which includes all the courses you will be taking this year.
- Check admission requirements in the programs that interest you.
- Assiniboia and District Career and Business Expo

October:

- You can start applying for Saskatchewan Polytechnic High Demand Courses as early as October 15.
- U of S Open House: Experience US
- U of R Open House: UR Connected
- Saskatchewan Polytechnic CSI Events: dates vary at each campus throughout the year

November/December/January:

- See Your Future Education and Career Fair (Regina and Saskatoon)- November
- Apply for a transcript request (www.k12.gov.sk.ca/etranscript/). Check off the boxes marked "Now" and "End of semester 1 and 2".
- Apply for residence or start looking for an apartment or house to rent.
- December 1: early admission deadline for students with an average over 90% to apply to the U of S Colleges of Engineering, Kinesiology and Business.

February 15:

- Application deadline for the U of S Competitive Entrance and the Guaranteed Entrance Awards.
- Deadline to apply for Kinesiology, Business, and Engineering at the U of S.
- Deadline to apply for Saskatchewan Polytechnic/U of R Nursing and High Demand programs.

March 1:

- Deadline to apply for U of R Education program.

March 15:

- Application deadline for U of R Competitive Entrance Awards.

May 1:

- Deadline for all Prairie South Schools' scholarships with supporting documentation.

May:

- To help you register for the correct classes, contact a post-secondary academic advisor and make an appointment to meet with him/her. If you prefer, many advisors will provide you with information via the phone or email.
- U of S: Attend U-Start Workshop
- U of R: Attend UR Ready Workshop
- Check into the cost of your program, and use the post-secondary budget planning handout to plan your year.

June:

- First week in June is when applications open for Canada-Saskatchewan Student Loans.
