

1. **Transcript Requests:** Grade 12 students who are applying to a post-secondary institution will need to send the institution a school transcript that lists the subjects they are taking in 2016-17. They will also need to request that a [transcript from the Ministry of Education](#) be sent to that institution. There is a \$20 fee. It is imperative that students check off the following in their request to ensure they aren't required to pay the fee more than once:

SASKATCHEWAN CAREER COLLEGES

- [Career Colleges](#), also known as private vocational schools, offer over 160 vocational training programs in Saskatchewan to prepare students for employment in a specific occupation such as business, health services, fashion, esthetics, hairstyling, and more. These schools are privately owned and operated but must be registered with the Ministry of Advanced Education and have approval of the programs they offer.

UNIVERSITY OF REGINA:

- Applications for the [U of R residences](#) are now open. Those students taking University of Saskatchewan, Saskatchewan Polytechnic, or Saskatchewan Indian of Technologies programs are welcome to stay in residence but must apply using [this process](#).
- [Admission on the Spot](#) will be held on December 1st in [Regina](#) and on December 7th in [Moose Jaw](#), 3:30 – 8:00 p.m. Students will be able to apply and receive admissions on this day if they come with a transcript and pay the reduced application fee of \$70. Students can apply to all faculties but may only be offered admission into the Faculties of Arts, Business, Engineering, Fine Arts, Kinesiology and Health Studies, Media and Art Performance, Science and Social Work. UNIVERSITY OF SASKATCHEWAN:

- The [Residence](#) application portal will open in the first week of November.
- There is an **early admission deadline of December 1** for the competitive ranking-based colleges of Engineering, Kinesiology and Edwards School of Business. Eligible applicants must have a specific admission average (90%+ for kinesiology, 83% for business & 85% for engineering). Students who apply with these averages will be offered conditional admission and will not need to wait for the competitive ranking to take place in February. The final application deadline for these colleges is still February 15. Remaining applicants will be ranked competitively and spaces will be offered from the top down according to admission average.
- The [Best and Brightest Scholarships](#) require students to apply for admission by December 1. The application for Best and Brightest Entrance Scholarships is due December 15.

SASKATCHEWAN POLYTECHNIC:

Scholarship Spotlight

Are you a Saskatchewan student planning to attend a Saskatchewan post-secondary institution?

If yes, congratulations! You are a scholarship winner. The [Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship](#) awards all Saskatchewan grade 12 graduates a scholarship of \$500 per year. Students may receive this scholarship up to a lifetime maximum of \$2,000. This scholarship is automatically applied to their tuition.

[Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship Industry \\$1000 scholarships](#) are rewarded each year to over 120 students who complete the Youth Apprenticeship passport. Each school nominates a potential candidate and winners are announced in June. Many Prairie South students have won this scholarship. Check with your school administrator or guidance counsellor for information on how you can earn 300 hours towards an apprenticeship trade along with the chance to win a \$1000 scholarship.
