





- 1. Many students feel unprepared for the academic demands of post-secondary. The lack of studying and writing skills are often cited as the main reasons for their unpreparedness. The <u>University of Regina Student Success Center</u> is willing to assist us in preparing our students by providing sessions at our schools. Session options include academic writing, research, note-taking, reading, study skills, writing tests and managing stress. - 2. The <u>Neil Squire Society</u> is a national not-for-profit organisation that assists people with disabilities (of any kind) in finding employment. 3. Must-have apps:

- Looking for a way to keep your school emails organized? Download the Microsoft Outlook app. It's free and allows you to browse through your school emails and documents at leisure. Also, it's a great idea to start thinking about a new email account just for post-secondary and scholarship applications and information. Look at your old one (not school email account) and ask yourself if it is the best one to use. If no, sign up for a new one. This way you are organized and won't miss those important emails!
- The <u>University of Regina (URFuture)</u> and the <u>University of Saskatchewan (iUsask)</u> have apps that you can download for free. These apps provide you lots of useful information like admissions information, upcoming events, maps, directories, announcements, etc. You can even personalize them to your own class and final exam schedules.

- 4. <u>The University of Regina's Accelerated Program</u> is a great opportunity for grade 12 students to take a university class such as English 100 and Math 110, lessening their course load in their first year at university. UNIVERSITY OF REGINA:

- Admission on the Spot will be held on December 7th in Regina and on December 6th in Mose Jaw, at Vanier Collegiate from 3:30 7:30 pm, in the library. Students will be able to apply and receive admissions on this day if they come with a transcript and pay the reduced application fee of \$70. Luther College will also be offering \$1000 discounts (\$500/semester) to any students who apply to Luther Residence at the event. Students can apply to all faculties but may only be offered admission into the Faculties of Arts, Business, Engineering, Kinesiology and Health Studies, Media and Art Performance, Science and Social Work.

- Applying For <u>Education</u>? Applicants must fill out the online <u>Teacher Education Application Profile</u> (<u>TEAP</u>) instead of "High School" as the application type when starting the online process. For more instruction on the process you can review this page before completing.
- High school students interested in applying to the <u>Faculty of Nursing</u> must do so through the <u>Saskatchewan Polytechnic</u> website. For more instruction on the application process you can review <u>this page</u>. Application deadline is **February 15th**.

UNIVERSITY OF SASKATCHEWAN:

- Students applying for <u>early admission</u> are reminded that the deadline is **December 1**st. Applying before then allows you to apply for the <u>Best and Brightest Entrance Scholarships</u>. The deadline to apply for these scholarships is **December 15**th.
- The priority deadline to apply to the U of S is **February 15th**. This maximizes students' award potential in the <u>Guaranteed Entrance Scholarships</u> and the <u>Competitive Entrance Awards</u>.
- The <u>How to Apply</u> page of U of S website will help you start your application process.
- Make sure to check the <u>Requirements and Deadlines</u> of the programs you are applying for.

Scholarship Spotlight

Are you a Saskatchewan student planning to attend a Saskatchewan post-secondary institution? If yes, congratulations! You are a scholarship winner. The <u>Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship</u> awards all Saskatchewan grade 12 graduates a scholarship of \$500 per year. Students may receive this scholarship up to a lifetime maximum of \$2,000. This scholarship is automatically applied to their tuition.

<u>Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship Industry \$1000 scholarships</u> are rewarded each year to over 120 students who complete the Youth Apprenticeship passport. Each school nominates a potential candidate and winners are announced in June. Many Prairie South students have won this scholarship. Check with your school administrator or guidance counsellor for information on how you can earn 300 hours towards an apprenticeship trade along with the chance to win a \$1000 scholarship.
