# Introduction

Prairie South Schools provides transportation for students requiring access to school in accordance with Board Policy and Administrative Procedures, *The Education Act, 1995* and The Traffic Safety Act. Provision is also made for special use of buses to enable students to participate in educational and extracurricular activities. We strive to provide safe, efficient, and punctual transportation for students in both the rural and urban areas.

During the 2020-21 school year, Prairie South Schools provided daily transportation services to 2591 students, traveling 18,012 kilometers on 107 bus routes. The safety of students and staff is our number one priority.

**Bus Drivers** provide safe, efficient, and punctual transportation of students. Drivers are provided a handbook outlining their responsibilities and a copy of the Saskatchewan School Bus Operating Regulations. To retain a school bus driver S Endorsement licence, a driver must retest every five years (through SGI) and they must have a current satisfactory medical examination on file with SGI. Drivers' Abstracts are reviewed annually by the office staff through the MySGI Online program and licenses are checked monthly using SGI's internet site.

New bus drivers receive training through our transportation office. Our Driver Safety Relations Officer provides circle checking training (pre-trip) and in-bus driver training. She will meet with the drivers for a minimum of three hours and drivers are encouraged to come and practice driving on their own once approved by the Driver Safety Relations Officer so they feel comfortable before going for their road test.

We also offer Circle Check Refresher Courses and other ongoing training for current bus drivers. First Aid/CPR Courses are also offered for bus drivers throughout the year.

In August of 2021 we were able to host two in-services with our bus drivers to prepare them for the upcoming school year. We reviewed our expectations around cleaning buses before and after each run as well as all the regular route package information. We also reviewed fire extinguisher safety and emergency evacuation procedures.

Students are expected to follow the same behaviour standards while riding school buses as are expected on school property or at school activities, functions or events. Bus drivers must communicate expectations and reinforce them appropriately. Additional supports and assistance are provided as necessary in cooperation with the school principal or their designate. Student conduct rules are posted on all school buses and bus drivers review these rules with students periodically throughout the year. At the beginning of every year, parents receive a Student Transportation Guide which outlines our rules as well as consequences to certain infractions that may occur on the school buse.

We have expanded on our First Rider program which was first started in August of 2018 in Moose Jaw and Assiniboia. In August 2019 we jointly hosted this program in Moose Jaw with the City of Moose Jaw, Moose Jaw Police Service and Holy Trinity School Division. In August 2021, we offered 75 students a first ride, over three days in both Moose Jaw and Assiniboia.

# Conveyance

As per Administrative Procedure 556, there are circumstances where parents may be eligible for a Conveyance Allowance up to a maximum of \$50/day. Conveyance may be available to eligible students based on their particular special need. Conveyance may also be available to French Immersion students residing outside of the Ecole Palliser Heights School and Ecole Gravelbourg School catchment areas. The actual amount of conveyance allowance is paid monthly and is calculated by multiplying the daily rate by the number of days the student was in attendance at school.

# **Maintenance Standards**

Prairie South has two bus garages: one in Moose Jaw and the other in Assiniboia. Both garages are licensed by Saskatchewan Government Insurance (SGI) as Vehicle Inspection Facilities for school buses.


SGI has a Carrier Profile System which is part of a national initiative to enhance safe-driving performance. The system collects information on the driving experience of our drivers, including traffic convictions, at-fault accidents, and on-road Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance inspections. This information is the basis for measuring our safety performance. Our profile rating during this reporting period is satisfactory unaudited.

School buses are always required to be maintained to provincial standards and pass a formal comprehensive inspection annually. In Saskatchewan, school buses must undergo a "bumper to bumper" safety inspection every 12 months.

All school buses must be maintained to minimum acceptable equipment safety standards when operated on a public road, through the implementation of a continuous preventative maintenance program. Our maintenance program is designed to keep our buses safe and to reduce delays and limit costly repairs to a minimum.

In June of 2019 we started using Asset Planner, which is a great software tool to track all services and maintenance done to our school buses. We also have all our parts inventory added to Asset Planner which makes tracking and ordering parts efficient for our shop foreman in both of our shops.

The total cost for damages assessed to the division was \$942. The majority of the damages did not compromise the integrity or safety of the bus, and the mechanics were able to fix them during the regular annual inspection, so no additional cost was associated with the accidents. The accident involving bus number 16-03 was considered a total loss. This accident was attributed to the freezing rain that morning on highway 42, and the bus driver was not at fault.

# **Current & Future Initiative(s) and Administrative Considerations**

- Continue holding Drivers' Committee Meetings to leverage local knowledge, identify emerging issues, promote professionalism amongst drivers and act as a forum for drivers to discuss things that are important to them.
- Discuss impact of Covid AP
- Review Conveyance Allowance AP (556) to respond to current shortages.
- Consider developing a budget line to reflect need for drivers to use their cell phones.
- Continue to develop relationships with bus drivers.
- Implement electronic student registration forms for transportation requests and charter trip forms for increased efficiencies for both transportation staff and school staff.
- Continue using Asset Planner to its full potential. Look at breaking down fuel costs for the 2020-21 school year by gas, diesel and propane.
- Continue promoting the Parent Portal in BusPlanner which gives parents information regarding their child's bus route and where their bus is at any given time.
- Recruitment of bus drivers is extremely important and continues to be an ongoing issue and one of our biggest concerns. Consider holding a recruitment event with trustee participation in each area.

#### SCHOOL BOARD AGREEMENT

**BETWEEN:** 

#### **KAWACATOOSE FIRST NATION**

(Hereinafter referred to as "Entitlement Band")

-and-

#### KAWACATOOSE TLE LAND HOLDING COMPANY LTD.

(Hereinafter referred to as "KTLE")

-and-

#### THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE PRAIRIE SOUTH SCHOOL DIVISION

(Hereinafter referred to as the "School Board")

**WHEREAS** KTLE is wholly-owned and controlled by the Entitlement Band and is the registered owner of the lands in the City of Moose Jaw, in the Province of Saskatchewan, and comprised of the following properties:

- Lots 33-37, Block 27, Plan H5292, civic address 804 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue West; and,
- Lots 38 & 38A-42, Block 27, Plan H5292, civic address 914 Caribou Street West (hereinafter referred to as the "Lands").

**AND WHEREAS** the School Board are school divisions within the City of Moose Jaw in the province of Saskatchewan;

**AND WHEREAS** the Entitlement Band is a party to the the 1992 Saskatchewan Treaty Land Entitlemen Framework Agreement (hereinafter referred to as the "Framework Agreement") and the Kawacatoose Band Treaty Land Entitlement Settlement Agreement (hereinafter referred to as the "Settlement Agreement");

**AND WHEREAS** the Entitlement Band is the sole owner and beneficial shareholder of KTLE, which holds the Lands in trust for the Entitlement Band;

**AND WHEREAS** KTLE and the Entitlement Band desire to have the Lands set apart under the Framework Agreement as an Entitlement Reserve for the use and benefit of the Entitlement Band in accordance with Article 9 of the Settlement Agreement;

**AND WHEREAS** KTLE, the Entitlement Band and the School Board agree that this Agreement will contemplate the compensation for loss of taxes, levies or grants which the School Board could reasonably have been expected to have received but for the setting apart of the Entitlement Reserve.

**NOW THEREFORE**, it is agreed as follows:

- 1. KTLE and the School Boards agree that the Entitlement Band will apply to have the Lands set apart as Entitlement Reserve for its use and benefit and shall be entitled, in such event, to the benefit of this Agreement.
- Subject to receiving payment as set out in Section 3 of this Agreement, the School Board consents to the Lands Being set apart as an Entitlement Reserve to be held by Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada for the use and benefit of the Entitlement Band.
- 3.
- a. The parties hereto agree that the Entitlement Band shall pay directly to the School Board a lump sum amount calculated as follows:
  - An amount equivalent to the annual school taxes levied in respect of the Lands for the year immediately preceding the year in which the Lands receive Entitlement Reserve status at 70% of twenty-five times the school taxes;
- b. KTLE and the Entitlement Band agree to promptly advise the School Board of the date upon which the Lands receive Entitlement Reserve status and shall calculate the amount to be paid under the formula as described above. KTLE and the Entitlement Band shall provide to the School Board a statement showing such calculation for their review and confirmation. Until the School Boards have been advised that the Lands have received Entitlement Reserve status, KTLE shall pay the annual school taxes levied in respect of the Lands.
- c. The parties further agree as follows:

- i. That the 2021 school taxes on Lot 33-37 (civic address 804 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue West) of the Lands are \$858.33.
- That the 2021 school taxes on Lot 38 & 38A-42 (civic address 914 Caribou Street West) of the Lands are \$6,028.97.
- iii. That the payment described in Section 3 relates to and is intended to provide compensation for tax losses that may arise as a result of the setting apart of the Lands as Entitlement Reserve.
- d. The lump sum payment as provided for in Section 3(1) shall be payable to the School Board by the Entitlement Band in ten (10) equal instalments as follows:
  - i. The first instalment shall be payable within thirty (30) days of the Lands receiving Entitlement Reserve status as evidenced through the passage of the Ministerial Order setting apart the Lands as an Entitlement Reserve for the use and benefit of the Entitlement Band under the terms of the Framework Agreement; and
  - ii. The remaining nine instalments shall be payable within thirty (30) days following the first through ninth anniversary dates from the date on which the Lands receive Entitlement Reserve Status.
- 4. Except as provided in Section 10, and upon receipt of the payments out in Section 3 of the Agreement, the School Board forever discharges and releases KTLE, the Entitlement Band, and Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada for the requirement to pay any additional or future amounts on account of the annual school tax levied in respect of the Lands and further waive any right and entitlement of whatever nature and kind, whether known or unknown, which the School Board ever had, now have, or may hereafter have against KTLE, the Entitlement Band or Her Majesty the Queen in Right of Canada by reason of, or in any way arising out of the annual school tax levied in respect of the Lands.
- 5. This Agreement may be amended at any time by the mutual consent of the parties. Any amendment to this Agreement must be made in writing and signed by the appropriate representative for each party.

- 6. In the event of any dispute with regard to the interpretation or enforcement of this Agreement, either party may refer the dispute to binding arbitration to be concluded in accordance with the *Commercial Arbitration Act R.S.C. 1985* and all regulations made thereunder and from time to time in force under that *Act*, with such arbitration to take place in the City of Moose Jaw in the Province of Saskatchewan. The decision of any arbitrator conducting the arbitration pursuant to this Agreement shall be final and binding and have the same force and effect as a final judgment in a Court of competent jurisdiction.
- 7. Each party shall assume its own costs of the arbitration and shall share equally in the fees of the chairperson and any other general expenses of the arbitration.
- 8. The parties hereto shall at all times and upon every reasonable request provide all further assurances and do such further things as are necessary for the purpose of giving full effect to the covenants and provisions contained in this Agreement.
- 9. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with all applicable legislation including, without limitation, the laws of Saskatchewan and the laws of Canada applicable therein.
- 10. The Entitlement Band, KTLE, and the School Boards each agree that the term of this Agreement shall be for the same duration as the Lands remain reserve land. This Agreement shall commence upon the Lands becoming an Entitlement Reserve.

Any notice given or required to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been given when mailed by registered mail, postage prepaid to the other party at the address stated below or at the latest changed address given by the party to be notified as hereinafter specified:
