HIGHLIGHTS

SCHOOL & DIVISION IMPROVEMENT ACCOUNTABILITY REPORT

The 2024-25 School and Division Improvement Accountability Report outlines Prairie South Schools' processes for aligning school Learning Improvement Plans (LIPs) with the Provincial Education Plan and the division's strategic priorities of Skills & Knowledge, Connection & Relationships, and Inclusive, Safe & Welcoming environments. LIPs are data-driven, collaboratively developed by staff and School Community Councils (SCCs), and reviewed annually by superintendents.

For 2024-25, 84 LIP goals were submitted, with 37 meeting their targets (up six from last year). Academic goals focused primarily on reading (24 schools), writing (10), and math (16). Well-being goals targeted belonging, attendance, and engagement. SCC involvement expanded through planning sessions, community events, and initiatives such as literacy nights, attendance campaigns (#YourPresenceMatters), and technology awareness activities.

Overall, the report highlights progress in school goal achievement, enhanced SCC collaboration, and growing community engagement to support student learning, attendance, and well-being across the division.
