## News

1. **2021 Graduates, you have a little time left to apply** for many [Prairie South Scholarships](#) being offered through the tremendous generosity of community and division supporters. Applications and supporting documentation must be submitted by **5:00 pm April 30**.
2. Interested in the RCMP? Read through the [application requirements](#). Attending a virtual [recruiting event](#) is one of the steps towards becoming a member.
3. CWEX teachers may nominate any grade 12 student who has taken a CWEX class at any time in high school for one of two \$200 scholarships sponsored by the Saskatchewan Career and Work Education Association (SCWEA). ### UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO:

### SOUTHEAST COLLEGE:

- A new Business Certificate is available in Fall 2021. All students entering this fall will receive a \$700 scholarship. With this, the tuition and materials total only \$5150, considerably lower than the cost at other locations. Click [here](#) for more information.

- You may already know that the U of S made changes to the College of Engineering, with their Re-Engineered program, starting fall 2021. Students will participate in a variety of activities designed to increase their success level in university—writing, academic integrity, communication, university expectations, note taking, exam prep, time management, study skills, procrastination, and stress management. Orientation is July 5. From July 5 to Aug 2, students complete readings for English 100, then the class runs Aug. 3 to 19, with the final exam Aug. 27. It gives new students a chance to experience a U of R class before the fall semester starts, and will give them an opportunity to develop their academic skills before taking on a full-load of classes. The program incorporates academics, university preparation, and social activities to prepare students to be successful at the University of Regina. Apply by **June 15**. - You can apply for [Education](#) all year long and may study on a part-time or full-time basis. As well, this year, most students will not have to complete Teacher Education Application Profile (TEAP). Exceptions are Le Bac and after degree (BEAD) programs.

## Scholarship Spotlight
