Attendance	 Students, staff, families who are ill should stay home. <i>Communications</i> Multiple modes of ongoing communication should occur. 	 Students and staff will continue to self-monitor for Covid-19 related symptoms. Recommend that students and staff stay home until symptoms have resolved. For more details, see AP 164.

Transportation	 Masks are required in all public indoor spaces as per the current <i>Saskatchewan Public Health</i> <i>Order.</i> Cleaning and disinfection should remain in place and be standard practice. 	 Seating plans may be established for all buses (regular routes and special runs). Hand sanitizer will be available on all buses. Daily cleaning/disinfecting of buses will be maintained.
Safe Access	School-day Structure	Visitors
	 No prescribed school-day structure is required. Masks are required in all public indoor spaces as per the current Saskatchewan Public Health Order. 	 Visitor sign-in and sign-out sheets. Online student registrations will continue.
Safe Facilities	 Facilities Masks are required in all public indoor spaces as per the current Saskatchewan Public Health Order. A school-wide plan for enhanced cleaning and disinfection should continue to be in place. Ensure handwashing facilities are operational (hot and cold running water) and stocked (soap and paper towel). 	 Enhanced Cleaning and Disinfection Means: High touchpoints are sanitized daily. Water fountains will be available in schools, strongly recommended to be used as water-bottle fill stations. Students and staff keep their workspace clean. Additional handwashing stations are available. Community use will follow the same enhanced cleaning and disinfection procedures. Hand sanitizer will be available in all facilities.

The Provincial Education Interim Plan provides guidance for this area. Assessment 	 Disposable masks will be available in all Prairie South Schools/Facilities. <i>Hygiene</i> Hand sanitizer will be available in all classrooms. <i>Instruction</i> Prairie South Virtual School will support students' full-time remotebased learning needs (grade 1 – 12). Instructional supports will be provided when students are away from school due to illness. Teachers will be encouraged to support students using online platforms for instruction, assessment, and communication.
Safe Activities	 Provincial exams are optional for the 2021-22 school year. Sports and Fitness Activities Resume regular activities. Dance, Drama, Band, Choir Resume regular activities. Staff are encouraged to avail themselves of all Ministry of Health recommended vaccinations. All staff will be required to be fully vaccinated or show proof of negative COVID test as per AP 430. In school vaccination clinics will be supported.
	 practice. Contact Tracing and Quarantining The collaboration between the Saskatchewan Health Authority and schools will continue and reflect the school's needs as required. When cases are identified in schools, schools and school divisions will continue to be notified by public health officials in order to inform students and parents. In addition, contract tracing will continue to occur, and unvaccinated close contacts may be directed to self-isolate as deemed appropriate by public health. 	 Contact Tracing and Quarantining Prairie South will continue to follow Public Health's direction and assist with contact tracing as needed.
