École Palliser Heights School

École Palliser Heights School is a dual-stream elementary school in the north-west of Moose Jaw. Our current enrollment is 640 students; 344 in the English stream and 296 in the French Immersion stream. Throwing in our 63 staff – made up of teachers, EAs, Admin Assistants and Facility Operators, we make up one of the largest schools in all Prairie South School Division.





We pride ourselves on the community spirit that we show each year. Like other schools in the division, we always 'do our part' for the Terry Fox Foundation and the Food Drive for Hunger Moose Jaw, and support International Recognition days such as Orange Shirt Day, Pink Shirt Day, and Lots Of Socks Day. In 2015, we raised over \$15,000 through our SRC to build a school in Africa and buy LOTS of goats, and are currently fundraising to install an all-inclusive play structure in our yard.





School Spirit is another aspect of Palliser that has remained strong throughout its existence. This is reflected in how often The Huskies are represented throughout the year. Our SRC tries to ensure that at least one Spirit day takes place each month and the participation from staff and students is always great to see. Henry The Husky actually became an active member of our school community for a while and could be seen in various places throughout the building.



As might be expected, we have a focused approach to delivering our curricular work, making sure that students can experience success across the full spectrum of curricular areas. The staff at Palliser work hard each year to provide a wide range of extra-curricular and alternate activities for students, including visits from the community. This year we have had very healthy representation in Cross-Country, Volleyball, Basketball, Curling, and Badminton, and have managed ski trips for our Grade 7s to Mission Ridge, and our Grade 8s to Asessippi in Manitoba. We have never let the weather get in the way – our Carneval in February of 2016 went ahead as planned – even in a blizzard! As well as sports we have established clubs for Choir, Drama, Table-Top Gaming, Morning Yoga, Art, Authors Tea, Creative Café, Chess, Guitar Club, Yearbook Production, and Student Representative Council. While many of these clubs are for our Middle Years students, we certainly make sure that our younger students can be included wherever possible. Our SCC also ensures that all students in the school are included in their annual Literacy Challenge – which includes photographic evidence as part of the challenge. This makes for a great display each year in our entrance hallway.





One of the things that adds to the uniqueness of ÉPHS is its ability to provide PAA for the Grade 7 and 8 students from ÉPHS, as well as the 7s and 8s from Sunningdale, Lindale, William Grayson, Empire, Prince Arthur and King George. Our liaison with PSS schools does not stop with students. During the March PD Day Palliser shared its gym with staff from Avonlea and Coronach where we collaborated on compiling a program of activities that dovetailed with the 7-character strengths contained within the "Thrivers" book by Michele Borba. We were incredibly fortunate to have Michele Zoom in with a 25-minute welcome, which really set the positive tone for a very productive morning. Additionally, we place high importance on diversity and inclusion, ensuring that all student needs are met and everyone feels a sense of belonging within our school. There is no doubt about it, École Palliser Heights School is a GREAT place to come each day - either as a student or as a staff member!
