Speech & Language Strategy of the Month...

Follow Their Lead

We can help children build their language skills by taking an interest in what they're interested in. Children are more likely to talk about things that draw their attention and motivate them. Allow your child to choose a toy, game, or activity and then join them in their play. Talk about what they are doing using simple language and repeat the same words/phrases/sentences often throughout the activity. Take turns. Let them make the rules and tell you how to play their game. Get down on their level, if possible and interact with them face-to-face. Be silly and have fun!

WHY BOOSTER SEATS ARE NECESSARY

Boosters seats are necessary during the period when children are too big for forward-facing child seat but are too small for a seat belt. The booster seat works by raising the child in the vehicle seat so the seat belt is properly positioned low over the child's hips, and collar bone (between the shoulder and neck). An incorrectly positioned seat belt over a child's abdomen can cause the child to be seriously injured or even killed in a collision.

SWIFT CURRENT MUSEUM SCHOOL & GROUP TOURS



Presented in Swift Current by the Métis Nation-Saskatchewan and the Swift Current Museum. The exhibition is developed by Library and Archives Canada in collaboration with the Manitoba Metis Federation and the Métis National Council, with the support of the Government of Canada.

Louis Riel

Explore some of the rich history of the Métis Nation by visiting Hiding in Plain Sight:

The exhibition aims to foster a better understanding of the history and culture of the Métis Nation.

The exhibition is organized into three sections:

- Who are the Métis?
- Individual portraits of wellknown or unidentified Métis.
- Eight themes related to the Métis Nation.

Learn about the lives of some of southwest Saskatchewan's earliest residents. From early experiences as bison hunters to contributions to cultural life, this exhibit explores the historical presence of the Métis people. The exhibit features artwork inspired from the history and landscape by Métis artist George Gingras.

This exhibit is suited for Middle Years and High School Students. Panel text is in English and French.

What to know about your trip to the museum

We are so excited to host your group at the museum. We will provide a place for jackets, boots and backpacks but encourage students to leave valuables at home. Tours generally run between 1.5-2.5 hours.

There is no running allowed in the museum and visitors may not touch the taxidermied animals.

\$3/student (optional donation.) The museum can invoice your group and payment can be made by cash, cheque or online.

Students may bring drink or snack and can have them at the carpet or table area inside of the museum. The museum does have a gift shop so students have the option to bring a small amount of money to buy a souvenir if the teacher/school allows.



Upcoming Temporary Exhibits- 2023

Space to Spoon

July-September
On loan from the Canada
Agriculture and Food Museum

What does a satellite orbiting 798 km from Earth have to do with the food on our plate? Space to Spoon demonstrates how Space technology benefits Canadian farmers and sustainable agriculture. It also highlights the Canadian Space Agency's Earth observation satellite, RADARSAT-2, and its cutting-edge successor, RADARSAT Constellation.

Enemy Aliens

October- December Internment in Canada 1914-1920

On loan from the Canadian War Museum

During the First World War, national security fears and wartime prejudice drove the policy of internment, which lasted until 1920. During this time, Canada interned 8,579 people identified as "enemy aliens", mainly Ukrainian and German immigrants, across a network of 24 camps. "Enemy alien" was the term used to describe citizens of states legally at war with the British Empire, and who resided in Canada during the war.

Using photographs drawn from Canadian archival collections one hundred years later, this exhibition explore internment operations and the experiences of the internees: who they were, the conditions they endured and the legacy they left behind.

GROUP & SCHOOL ACTIVITIES



Animal Classification- PreK- Grade 6

This hands on, interactive activity guides students through grouping animals and what adaptations make animals unique. The animals of SW Saskatchewan are covered in the guided tour of the permanent gallery. Aprox 1.5 hours.

Settlers Survival- Grade 4- Adult

Your group has just arrived to the Hamlet of Swift Current in the early 1900s. Times are hard on the open prairies. Visit places in town like the Doctor, Royal Mail, North West Mounted Police to learn your fate and see if you survive your first year as a pioneer. Aprox 1.5 hours.

I Spy- All Ages

Museum staff have created 6 different I Spy sheets in varying degrees of difficulty from easy to impossible. Aprox 15 minutes per sheet.

Bugs in a Bucket- PreK- Grade 6

Our staff collects these creatures from the creek for your class to explore what lives in the Swift Current Creek. Aprox 45min.

Wind Tunnel- All ages fun!

Will it wind tunnel? We have a number of items to try and see if the wind will carry them up the tunnel. You can also use the materials provided to create something new that will fly! Aprox 10-20 minutes but sometimes hard to tear people away!

Historical Walking and Driving Tours

Take a walk through the historic downtown or Mount Pleasant Cemetery on a guided tour of the business from the past 100 years. The driving tour is a self guided path that takes you around the city to visit highlights with information on large billboards. Aprox 1.5 hours.



Decipher the question using a secret code, determine the answer. Break into the locked box and receive a prize if you are correct! Aprox 15 min.








